

Overview of Specific Areas of Responsibility

Camper Registration:

The Health Care Volunteer assists with camper registration by reviewing all Health & Release Forms, collecting and organizing all medication brought by campers, conducting health screenings as necessary, and informing counselors of camper's medical needs for the week.

During The Week:

The Health Care Volunteer is asked to:

- Serve as primary health care advisor to all campers and staff.
- Over-see administration of all prescription and non-prescription medications.
- Respond to medical treatment demands (first aid, emergencies, illnesses).
- Complete all appropriate documentation.
- Keep infirmary organized.
- Make recommendations to the Camp Director regarding equipment and supplies.
- Attend staff meetings.
- Enjoy the camp's program & activities!

▶ What does the schedule look like?

The week starts on Sunday at 12:30pm. You will be responsible for helping with registration and check in. Our campers will come to you at four scheduled times during the week to receive their medication with their counselor: after breakfast, after lunch, after dinner and before bed-time. Between these times, dive into plenty of camp activities, or take opportunities for rest and relax. The week concludes on Friday at 2:30pm.



▶ Family Accommodations

The Health Care Volunteer and their immediate family stay in the Lodge above the kitchen

and receive free room and board. Children have the option of participating in the camp program for a discounted price (they will be placed in a cabin group) or staying with family members in the Lodge. All family members not participating in the camp program are the responsibility of the Health Care Volunteer.

What kind of HEALTH Care Volunteers are we looking for?

Camp needs individuals who:

Heal: Helps provide health care to those who have become injured and/or need medical attention.

Educate: Educates campers and staff on how to respond to the physical needs of the body and makes health and safety improvement suggestions so the camp program may be the best possible.

Administer: Administers medication to campers and staff as necessary.

Listen: Listens to the health needs and concerns of campers and staff.

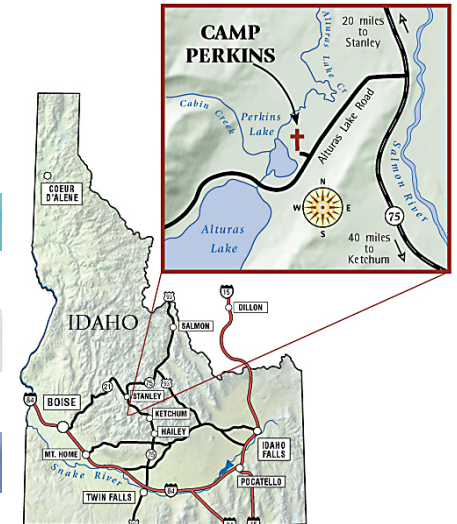
Thorough: Is thorough in providing all health care and follow-up treatment and completing the necessary documentation.

Health Checker: Performs camper health checks during opening registration Sunday afternoon.
